Protect Yourself!

Influenza pandemics are unpredictable but recurring events that can have harsh consequences on human health and the economic well-being worldwide. The most recent one that we are faced with is the H1N1 virus, more commonly known as "Swine Flu".

Advanced planning and preparedness are important to help lessen the impact of a global pandemic. Below are some simple tips on how to be more prepared:

- Stay informed. Recognize symptoms of various types of illnesses and contact a medical doctor immediately upon onset of these symptoms. Keep yourself up-to-date on flu outbreaks, get news alerts online, listen, read or watch news reports.
- Wash your hands. The first line of defense to prevent transmission from person-to-person is to exercise careful hand hygiene. Wash hands frequently with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if hands are not visibly soiled.
- Cover your cough and sneeze. Using a disposable tissue, cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people. A surgical mask can reduce the number of droplets coughed into the air. Ask a sick person to wear a mask if one is available provided the person can tolerate it.
- Raw food always should be handled hygienically because it can be associated with many infections, including salmonella. Therefore, all utensils and surfaces (including hands) that come in contact with raw meats should be cleaned carefully and immediately afterwards with water and soap.
- Avoid traveling, going to work or school or other public places while ill.
